

Mariners

As you can see from the picture, it would be difficult to find a spot closer to the sea! Mariners, originally the brew house and cattle shed for a local Public house is situated right on the coastal path. In days past Pilgrims travelling to St Davids would stop here for refreshment. Since that time Mariners has undergone some considerable change and a few years ago underwent a full refurbishment to bring the property into the 21st century without spoiling its rustic charm.

We added a wood burner, heating in the bedrooms, Dormer windows and a washing machine. Antique Welsh furniture, a stuffed swan and the original Mariners sign add a flavour of the unusual. However, Mariners is our family beach house and although comfortable and cosy it is relatively basic and a slightly worn around the edges. Don't expect a microwave or television but do feel free to relax!

Mariners has three bedrooms (1 double, 1 twin, 1 with bunk beds) a sitting room with dining table with sea view, kitchen, and bathroom.

Although the property is enclosed by hedges and fencing we cannot guarantee that naughty children and dogs will not escape!

Access to the property, due to its location, is not straightforward and may not suit disabled holidaymakers.

Newport and the Parrog

Newport can be found between the Ferry port of Fishguard and the market town of Cardigan. Originally a busy port it is situated beneath the last and largest of the Preseli range, Carn Ingli or Mount of the Angels. The town is built on an estuary and benefits from a number of natural beauties including the sands that form one flank.

Parrog runs along the sea front and is a highly sought after area for families with children who want to take advantage of the sea and the town. Newport boasts facilities one expects from a small town, including some excellent restaurants shops and Pubs. For golfers there is a 9 hole golf course just behind the sands and for sailors the local boat club provides monthly membership and competitive racing in the bay during the weekends.
